

Genesis 25.105-112

These are the descendants of Isaac, Abraham's son: Abraham was the father of Isaac, and Isaac was forty years old when he married Rebekah, daughter of Bethuel the Aramean of Paddan-aram, sister of Laban the Aramean. Isaac prayed to the LORD for his wife, because she was barren; and the LORD granted his prayer, and his wife Rebekah conceived. The children struggled together within her; and she said, 'If it is to be this way, why do I live?' So she went to inquire of the LORD. And the LORD said to her,

'Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples born of you shall be divided; one shall be stronger than the other,

the elder shall serve the younger.'

When her time to give birth was at hand, there were twins in her womb. The first came out red, all his body like a hairy mantle; so they named him Esau. Afterwards his brother came out, with his hand gripping Esau's heel; so he was named Jacob. Isaac was sixty years old when she bore them.

When the boys grew up, Esau was a skilful hunter, a man of the field, while Jacob was a quiet man, living in tents. Isaac loved Esau, because he was fond of game; but Rebekah loved Jacob

Once when Jacob was cooking a stew, Esau came in from the field, and he was famished. Esau said to Jacob, 'Let me eat some of that red stuff, for I am famished!' (Therefore he was called Edom.) Jacob said, 'First sell me your birthright.' Esau said, 'I am about to die; of what use is a birthright to me?' Jacob said, 'Swear to me first.' So he swore to him, and sold his birthright to Jacob. Then Jacob gave Esau bread and lentil stew, and he ate and drank, and rose and went his way. Thus Esau despised his birthright.

Psalm 119 .105-112

Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.

I have sworn an oath and confirmed it, to observe your righteous ordinances.

I am severely afflicted; give me life, O Lord, according to your word.

Accept my offerings of praise, O Lord, and teach me your ordinances.

I hold my life in my hand continually, but I do not forget your law.

The wicked have laid a snare for me, but I do not stray from your precepts.

Your decrees are my heritage for ever; they are the joy of my heart.

I incline my heart to perform your statutes for ever, to the end.

Romans 8. 1-11

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and to deal with sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, so that the just requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. To set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. For this reason the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law—indeed it cannot, and those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, though the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of right-eousness. If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you.

Gradual Hymn

The Gospel of Matthew 13. 1-9,18—23

The seed is the word of God; Christ is the sower; All who come to him will live forever.

That

same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the lake. Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. And he told them many things in parables, saying: 'Listen! A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Let anyone with ears listen!'

'Hear then the parable of the sower. When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what is sown in the heart; this is what was sown on the path. As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; yet such a person has no root, but endures only for a while, and when trouble or persecution arises on account of the word, that person immediately falls away. As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the lure of wealth choke the word, and it yields nothing. But as for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundred-fold, in another sixty, and in another thirty.'

A RELECTION

One of the themes that courses through the New Testament is that your walk with God is designed by God to be a community project. Anonymous, consumerist, isolated, independent, self-sufficient, Jesus and me". Christianity is a distant and distorted facsimile of the faith of the New Testament. You and I were not simply created or recreated in Jesus Christ to live all by our selves. The biblical word pictures of temple (stones joined together to a place where God dwells) and (each member dependent on the function of the other) decimate any idea that healthy Christianity can live outside essential community.

Yet many, many believers live their lives with a huge separation between their public church personas and the details of their private experience. We are very skilled at brief, non personal conversations about weather, sports and politics. We are learned at giving either non answers or spiritually platitudinous answers to people's questions. We live in long term networks of terminally casual relationships. No one really knows us beneath the well - crafted public display, and because they don't know us, they cannot minister to us, because no one can minister to that which he does not know.

Moreover, we think we know ourselves and we think we're okay ,forgetting the blinding power of sin. That's why church is for many of us nothing more than a thing to attend on Sunday. Church is a formal set of activities. A Church is a buffet of regularly scheduled, designed religious offerings. Church is a place where music can be enjoyed and sermons heard .Church is what connects to worldwide missions .Church provides wholesome activities for children. But church isn't an interdependent, webbed -together community of personally focused love and grace for us all. .

But the Bible is clear .When each part is working properly the body of Christ grows to maturity in Christ .We each need to live intentionally intrusive ,Christ centered ,grace driven redemptive community. This community is meant to enlighten and protect. It is to motivate and encourage .It is meant to rescue and restore. It is meant to instill hope and courage .It is meant to confront and rebuke .It is meant to guide and protect .It is meant to give vision and sound warning. It is meant to incarnate the love and grace of Jesus when you feel discouraged and alone.It is meant to be visible a representation of the grace of Jesus that is our hope ,It is not a luxury .It is spiritual necessity .

The book of Genesis presents the epic narrative of the founding of the people of Israel. It begins with the creation of life, the universe and everything, especially humankind. Our Parish Consultations are complete and Canon Carla Archer will feed that information to Bishop Mark. Some of that material will answer the remaining information needed to complete the Cathedral Profile for prospective applicants. For now, we wait and pray. All is in the hands of Bishop Mark for the time being.

Thank you for the wonderful response we had in so many of you participating in the process.

Today is Sea Sunday. Being a seafarer is tough. Crews can spend months away working long hours with little respite or contact with home. On top of the daily pressures, the threat of piracy, shipwreck and abandonment are ever present for the men and women who serve us at sea. In recent years, this challenging job has become even harder. Increased restrictions and lockdowns, due to the global covid-19, saw many seafarers working beyond the end of their contract, facing months of uncertainty and further separation from loved ones. That's months of missed birthdays, anniversaries, funerals and family celebrations.

Amid these challenges, The Mission to Seafarers has been a constant source of practical support and reassurance. Through teams in more than 200 ports worldwide, its has helped the 1.5 million unseen keyworkers who have helped to keep the economy afloat and transport the essentials we need to survive. Our port centres have always been a haven for mentally and physically exhausted seafarers. For those who can't make it into the centres, chaplains give a warm welcome and listening ear onboard. Otherwise email, social media and WhatsApp have been a lifeline of support. Do pray for our Seafarers.

Safe Ministry Training Update

Since 2018 there have been substantial changes in the legislative landscape (such as the Child Safe Standards, and updates in both civil and criminal law) that have resulted in the course being updated. Therefore, as a matter of importance can I ask that all clergy and senior parish leaders (ie: Wardens and Parish Counsellors, etc) have attended a Level 3 Course either in person or through Zoom as soon as it practicable.

As Level 3 training about Implementation of Safe Ministry Policy and procedures at a Parish level we recommend that you attend together as a parish council and/or ministry team (either in person on via Zoom).
