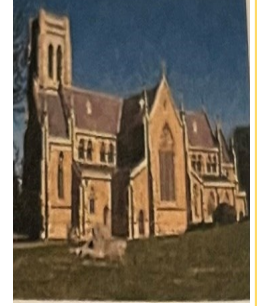

## ***From the Dean's Desk:***

Dear All,

I thought that seeing this Sunday is the celebration of Michael and All Angels, otherwise known as Michaelmas, that I would do a bit of a Google search and see what came up. Here is what I found.

It's celebrated by many Western Christian traditions on September 29th, and on 8<sup>th</sup> November in the Eastern Church. In the Northern Hemisphere, Michaelmas marks the end of the harvest season and the beginning of autumn. It's named after St. Michael the Archangel, who is considered a protector against the forces of evil. Alongside him, the celebration also honours other angels like Gabriel and Raphael.

One of the most interesting things about Michaelmas is the food. Traditionally, people eat goose on this day. There's an old saying, "Eat a goose on Michaelmas Day, want not for money all the year." So, if you're looking for some extra money, a goose dinner might be the way to go. There was also the custom of baking a special bread, called *Sruthan Mhicheil*. The bread was made from equal barley, oats, and rye mixed with milk without using any metal implements. The cake is then slathered with a mixture of egg, cream and butter before being cooked on the stove top. In some places, Michaelmas is also known as "Quarter Day." This was one of the days when rents were traditionally due, and it was a time for hiring new servants and farm workers. It was kind of like a mini New Year's Day. And let's not forget the folklore! There's a legend that when St. Michael kicked Lucifer out of heaven, the devil fell into a blackberry bush. In his anger, he cursed the fruit, so it's said that blackberries shouldn't be picked after Michaelmas.

Michaelmas is a day filled with history, good food, and tall tales. Whether you're celebrating with a goose dinner, Michaelmas Bannocks or just enjoying a Quarter Day, it's a day with plenty of tradition.

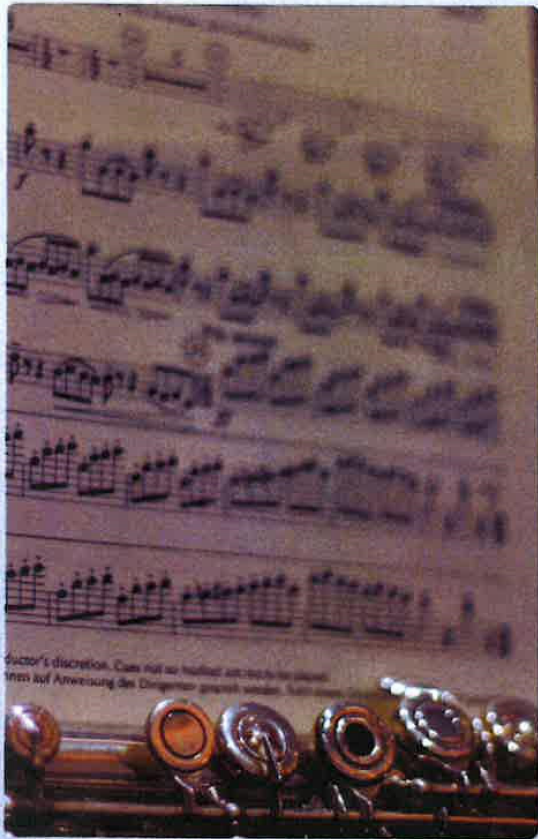
