Reading from ACTS Chapter2 beginning at 1st Verse

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?' But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.'

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

"In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.

Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy.

And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

STEWARDSHIP.....NOW IS THE TIME

May they all be one; just as you, Father are in me, and I in you, so may they be at one in us, in order that the world may believe that you have sent me.

One of the truisms of Christian life is the expression - *bloom where you are planted* and all of us have been planted here. In this Anglican Church, in this Cathedral.

I believe that we are blessed with the gift of worshipping in this place and community.

The Wardens and Cathedral Council work hard to manage the complex and challenging budget of the Cathedral, which are quite different from those of an ordinary parish.

As various affects from the pandemic have kicked in and some of our other sources of income have stopped temporarily, we have come to somewhat of a crunch.

With costs constantly increasing to maintain our worship there are only so many ways that the Wardens and Cathedral Council can juggle the budget.

It is timely to look at our regular meaningful giving. If any of you are able to give a one of donation that would be helpful too.

Since it has been before the pandemic we last spoke together on stewardship and reviewed our regular meaningful giving it is a fitting time to do so.

This is something all of us as followers of Jesus need to do.

In another parish in which I served one of our elderly ladies was reminiscing about her mother's devotion to the faith, and to the church that she would give 5 shilling regularly to the church. This would have been in the early twentieth century, about 1905 and now she, the lady I was talking to, continues with the same tradition, that is she gives 50c a week. In the 2000s!

Our giving needs to be regular and meaningful.

Whether you see yourself as one of the 'haves' or 'have nots', regular giving which is meaningful to you needs to be part of our Christian life.

Regular meaningful giving is part of our Christian discipline.

STEWARDSHIP.....NOW IS THE TIME

It can help to counteract the constant messaging we receive that *we are what we have* and to feel good we have to buy things, or the inordinate worry over money matters.

Our Cathedral is a place of incomparable beauty which makes it easy to find the presence of God day by day Sunday by Sunday.

Our Cathedral is a place where worshipping in beauty and quietness is valued.

Our Cathedral also a diverse community - a community which I doubt could exist in your average suburban parish; a community which is unique in this rural city.

A community which is also a blessing of the Spirit. A community which each of us needs to support;

To continue to be blessed in this place, and to be this loving witness, all of us need to consider looking again at our stewardship.

During the pandemic we asked everyone to move over to electronic giving and many of you did. This has been helpful. I would like others to consider that too. If you are not computer wise, you just take your pew-sheet down to your bank and ask them to set it up.

So over to you all now.

I'm going to end with a verse from Paul who was talking about the very same thing in his letter to the church in Corinth:

'The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.'

MEDIA STATEMENT SAVING THE GREAT EAST WINDOW OF GOULBURN ANGLICAN CATHEDRAL



The Dean of the Cathedral, Phillip Saunders, has announced a \$250,000 program to restore the Great East Window of St.Saviour's Cathedral. Conservation work on the fabric of the 138-year-old Cathedral, to stabilize the foundations of the window and repair cracking in the stone tracery and stained-glass, has become urgent.

The work has been made possible by a grant of \$120,000 from the New South Wales Government under the Caring for State Heritage category of the NSW Heritage Grants Program, on the recommendation of the Heritage Council of NSW.

A matching co-contribution is being provided by the Cathedral's National Trust Heritage Restoration Fund.

The work requires excavation and stabilization of the foundations of the East façade of the Cathedral to enable conservation of the window stone tracery and stained-glass by skilled craftsmen.

This project continues the programme of restoration of this famous Edmund Blacket Cathedral which commenced in 2015 when the Cathedral received a NSW Heritage Grant of \$150,000 to assist in installing air drains and stone conservation to successfully eliminate serious rising damp.

The Great East Window is one of the earliest examples in Australia of the work of English stained-glass makes, the firm of Heaton, Butler and Bayne, who were known as 'the three stained-glass whiz dis'. Their work has been described as some of the world's greatest stained-glass masterpieces. They established their studio in Covent Garden, London and went on to become one of the leading manufacturers of Gothic revival stained-glass. Famous Victorian architects commissioned their work, and there is a Heaton, Butler and Bayne window in Westminster Abbey.

The Dean welcomed the NSW Heritage grant to help preserve the integrity and safety of the Window, which is extremely important for the Cathedral, not only for the significance of it stained-glass beauty, but also its association with two notable pioneers.

The Window is dedicated to
William Bradley, one of the trustees
of the Cathedral, and his wife,
Emily Elizabeth.
The dedication reads

Erected in the memory of William Bradley, born 1800, died 1868, and of Emily Elizabeth his wife, born 1812, died 1848, by their daughters Emily Jane Pearse, Kate Heard, Minnie Robinson, Alice Caroline Roberts in 1885.

Bradley was one of the first settlers on the Goulburn Plains and had substantial grazing interests on the Monaro. He was the landholder par excellence and a politician. In 1843 he was returned unopposed for Argyle to the Legislative Council NSW and was an active promoter of railways, helping to finance the survey of the line to Goulburn. Emily Bradley was the only daughter of William Hovell, the explorer, who lived in Goulburn and is buried in the old St.Saviour's cemetery.
