SECOND READING

Reading from 2 THESSALONIANS Chapter 3 beginning at 6th Verse

But the Lord is faithful; he will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one. And we have confidence in the Lord concerning you, that you are doing and will go on doing the things that we command. May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ.

Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labour we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls.

Many women have now become priests in Canberra-Goulburn and all across Australia. Called by God they have taken up all possible roles, even to the height of Archbishop. We have women as Diocesan and Assistant Bishops, Deans of cathedrals, Defence Force chaplains, CEOs in Anglican and other voluntary organisations, school chaplains, hospital chaplains, professional mentors, spiritual directors and counsellors

At the service, our Diocesan Bishop Mark welcomed the seven who were able to attend, along with The Right Reverend Sarah Macneil, the first diocesan elected female bishop in Australia, our Assistant Bishop Carol Wagner and Bishop Genieve Blackwell, currently Assistant Bishop of Melbourne, who preached.

We had a soloist soprano, Victoria Knox and organist Brett McKern.

Well organized by Lucy Clothier, refreshments flowed thanks to the gracious help of so many parishioners and an added treat was that the sun shone on all!



RING FOR THE KING!

For centuries church bells have sounded, calling people to worship, in celebration of special occasions, in remembrance and to mark special events.

The British Monarch is the Supreme Governor of the Church of England. Since the Anglican Church of Australia is in communion with the Church of England, Australia's Anglican Cathedrals tolled their bells in September to mark the death of HM The Queen. In the same way, bellringers across the country are making plans to "Ring for the King" at the coronation of King Charles III.

The Cathedral is appealing for volunteers to get involved in the preparations and take hold of a bellrope ready for the big event.

Dr Christopher O'Mahony, our Ringing Master said "Our hope is that, if volunteers step forward now, they will be well and truly ready to ring for the King's coronation, which takes place in six months' time."

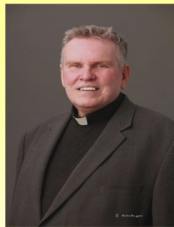
